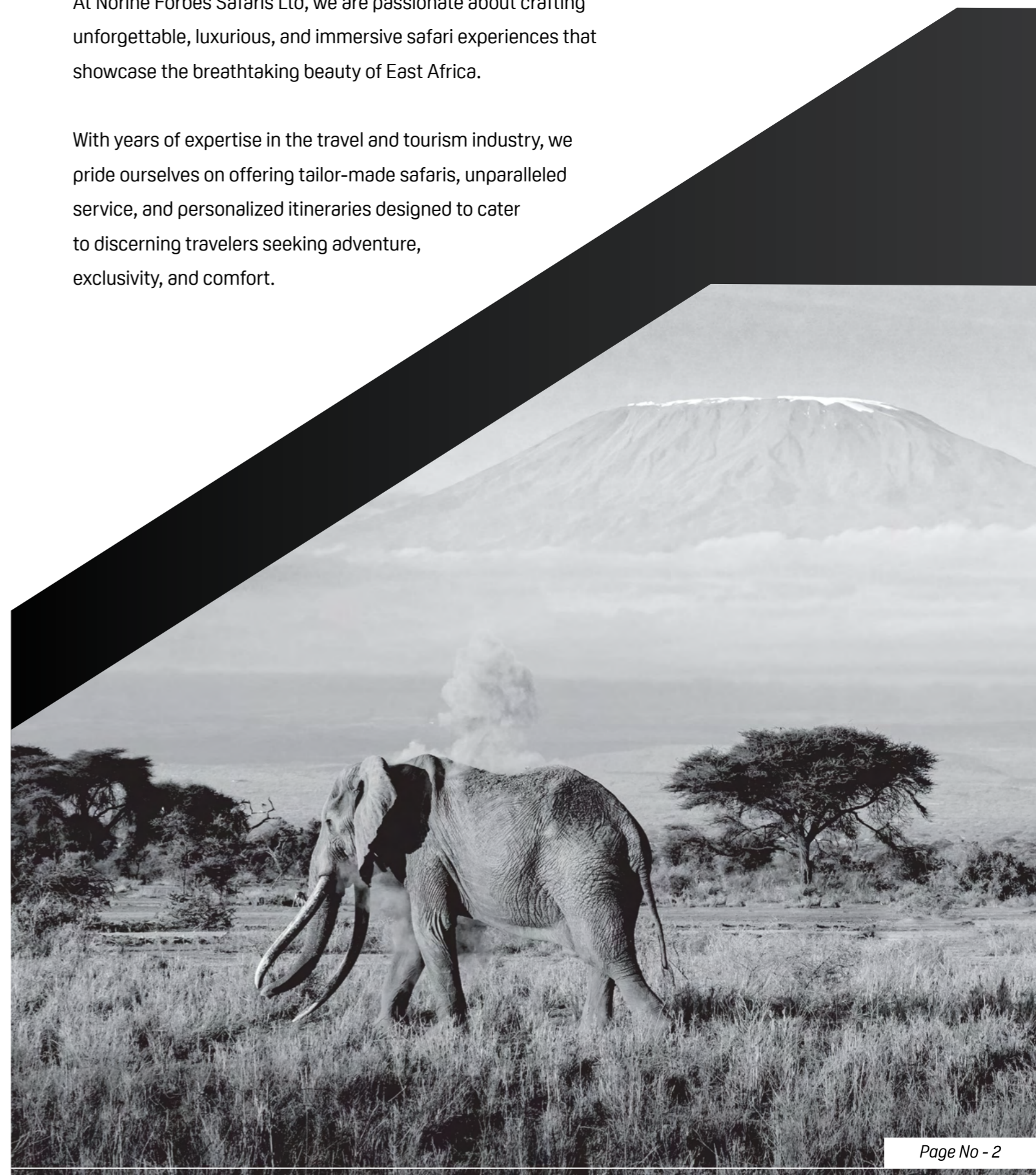

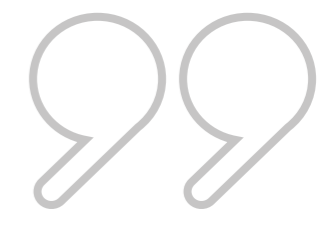

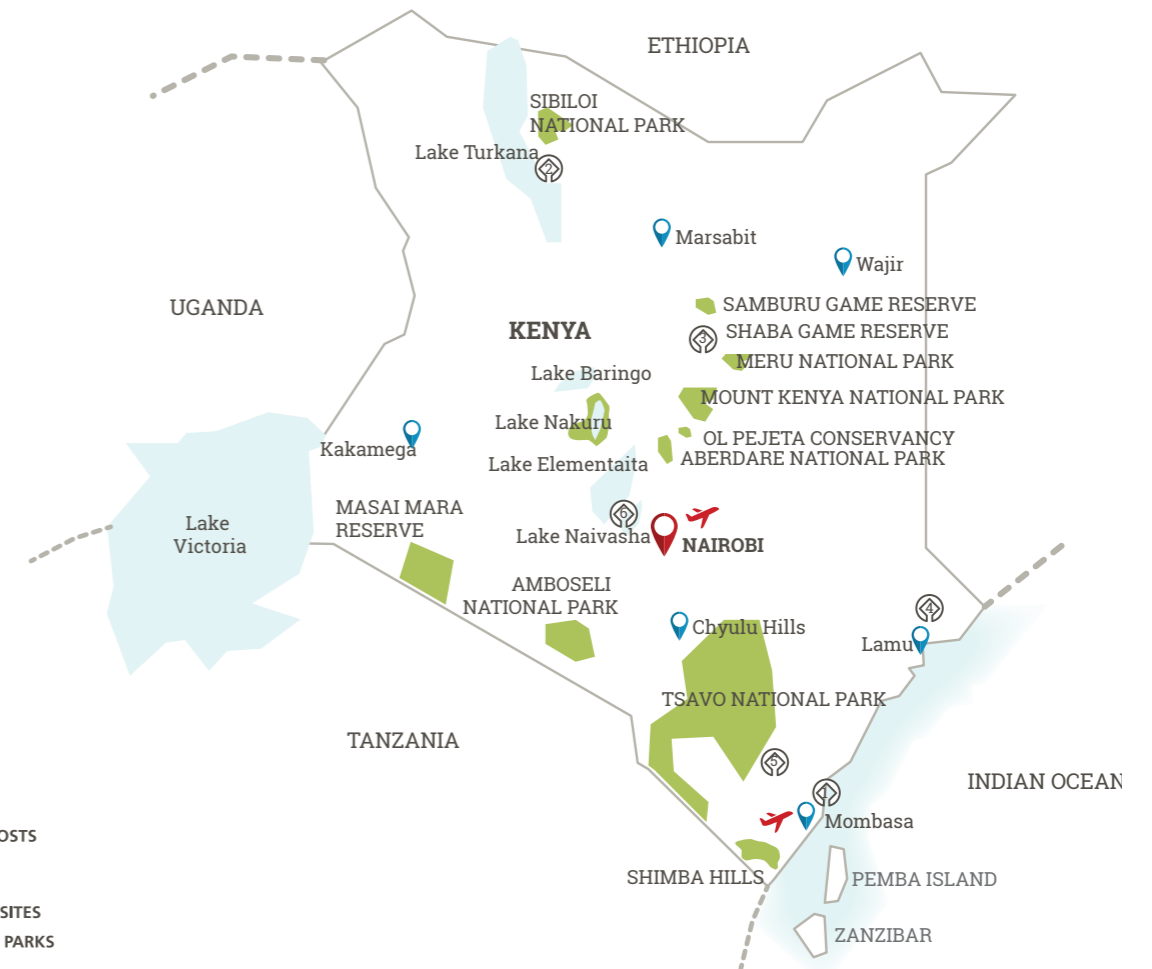

Parks of KENYA

Nairobi National Park

Nairobi is the largest city and capital of Kenya, famous for the world's only game reserve found within a major city, the Nairobi National Park. This park is home to the world's densest population of rhino. In addition, the park has diverse bird life with 400 species recorded. Northern migrants pass through the park primarily during late March through April.

To the south of the park are the Athi-Kapiti Plains and Kitengela Migration and dispersal area. These are vital areas for herbivores dispersal during the rains and concentrate in the park in the dry season. Open grass plains with scattered acacia bush are predominant. The western side has a highland dry forest and a permanent river with a riverine forest in the south.

Meru National Park

Situated in northern Kenya, in an area of 870km², Meru National Park is an untamed wilderness featuring lush jungle, coursing rivers, verdant swamp and khaki grasslands. The western border is fringed by the Nyambeni Hills, topped with pockets of protected forests, which are the source of 13 permanent rivers that feed into the park. This remote and unspoilt paradise provides a chance to see Grevy's zebra, elephant, Bohor reedbuck, hartebeest, snakes, buffalo and more than 427 species of birds. Meru National Park is famously associated with the book and film "Born Free". Meru's successful rhino sanctuary now covers a substantial 80km² protecting around 40 white rhino and 20 black rhino.

Kalama Conservancy

This protected land plays host to a section of the great Ewaso Nyiro River and the acacia grasslands holds promise of well fed cattle for the Samburu people and wildlife alike. Feeding off the land for centuries and understanding the harsh terrains of northern Kenya, the grazing of cattle remains a volatile livelihood, however registering Kalama as an NRT. Conservancy has enabled members of the community to diversify their income through alternative livelihoods.

Samburu National Reserve

This picturesque park located in the Samburu County in north-central

Kenya is rugged open savannah renowned for rare species of animals unique to the park. These species include the long necked gerenuk, Grevy's zebra, reticulated giraffe, Beisa oryx and leopard. With over 450 species of birds this reserve is utopia for bird lovers.

Shaba National Reserve

This protected area has plentiful wildlife that graze off the varied scenery of forests, woodlands and dry grassy plains. The rare Williams's lark is found in the regions of rocky lava semi-desert with low barleria shrubs. Endangered Grevy's zebra can be spotted here. Klipspringer and hyrax are popular amongst the hills. A large lion pride live alongside other predators such as the golden jackal, black-backed jackal and hyena. The park is also famous for its location being the setting of the famous book and film 'Born Free', for the film 'Out Of Africa'.

Oi Pejeta Conservancy

Oi Pejeta is a conservancy that uses agriculture and tourism to create surpluses solely for the reinvestment in conservation and community development. It's the largest black rhino sanctuary in East Africa. It also is the only sanctuary for chimpanzees in Kenya and a safe haven for animals rescued from the black market. Visit the Endangered Species Boma and see the white rhino, Grevy's zebra and Jackson's hartebeest up close and personal.

Laikipia Plateau

This plateau extends over 9 500km² from the foothills of Mount Kenya to the shores of Lake Baringo. This is one of the lesser travelled wildlife areas to visit in Kenya however with more endangered species than anywhere else in East Africa. One can see the Grevy's zebra, Jackson's hartebeest and wild dog here. The area is split into large conservancies, otherwise known as ranches, which are all very different from one another and have different vested interests from the local communities. Laikipia Wildlife Forum was founded and an influential wildlife stronghold was born.

Mount Kenya National Park

The majestic Mount Kenya is the backdrop to this exceptional scenery

and park offering its visitors mountain climbing, game viewing, cave exploration and camping.

The park was established in 1949 to protect Mount Kenya, the wildlife and surrounding environment. This aligned to the importance of tourism for the area and the conservation of both the biodiversity and water catchment for the surrounding area. The vegetation and wildlife in this region has adapted to the unique climate.

Aberdare National Park

Though small in size, Kenya's picturesque Aberdare National Park is a vastly different experience to the country's more famous savannah reserves. Steep forested ravines and open moorland provide a habitat for a variety of game. Rare sightings include the giant forest hog, bongo, golden cat, serval cat, African wild cat, African civet cat and the blue duiker.

Created to protect the Aberdare Mountains of the Central Highlands, an isolated volcanic range that forms the eastern wall of the Rift valley, it comprises 2 ecosystems unusual to Kenya: a moorland plateau and a dense rainforest. Aberdare National Park is popular and easily accessible, particularly in the drier months of January and February.

Lake Nakuru National Park

This is one of Kenya's most notable and finest national parks, varying in diversity and pleasing to the eye. With rare tree-climbing lions often sighted at the forested area below Flamingo Hill, one must look up rather than down, to spot these predators.

A bird lover's haven, the park hosts over 400 bird species including 5 globally threatened species, and is an important stop on the African-Eurasian Migratory Flyway. It also has a rhino sanctuary that protects the endangered white and black rhino.

Masai Mara National Reserve

The Masai Mara National Reserve is not a national park but a reserve as it belongs to the Maasai since the 17th century. It's one of the most popular reserves in Africa. A Maasai village visit is essential in order to understand the culture and simple way of life. The game viewing in this region is spectacular with morning, afternoon and night drives offered. The most famous sighting is the Great Migration which takes place in July and August every year. A hot-air balloon ride at sunrise shows this magnificent splendour from a whole new perspective.

Amboseli National Park

Amboseli National Park's most anticipated feature is getting up close and personal to large-tusked elephants with Africa's highest peak, Mount Kilimanjaro, in the background. There is an elephant research camp in the heart of the park, which is not open to the public; however, you may book via the website for a 1 hour lecture. Noomotio, or otherwise known as Observation Hill, is one of the only areas of the park where you may get out and explore by foot. The Sinet Delta running along the northern route outside Amboseli is excellent for bird watching with over 370 species in the park.

Tsavo West National Park & Tsavo East National Park

Tsavo is the largest national park in Kenya at 22 000km² as well as one of the largest in the world. This park was divided due to the railway going from Mombasa to the interior of Kenya. Tsavo East is the larger of the two parks, wild in nature and character with easier game viewing due to the flat, dry grassy plains. One of Kenya's largest rivers, the Galana River flows through the park. The park has over 500 bird species and predators such as lion, leopard and cheetah.

Tsavo West is more dramatic with diversity in landscapes ranging from swamps and springs to mountainous terrain. This park is known for its birdlife and large mammals as well as smaller plains game. The Shetani Lava Flows and Mzima Springs are points of interest within the park amongst many natural landmarks and look-out points for maximum game viewing.



Kenya ATTRactions

Home of the safari

Safari was born in Kenya, over 100 years ago. Archetypal journeys take place in the open savannahs under big skies with plenty of iconic wildlife and a chance to see the million-strong annual wildebeest migration plunging down the Mara River. Kenya is a year-round wildlife destination, from the 'elephant country' of Amboseli to the bird-rich lakes in the Great Rift Valley, the uncommon animals of the north and marine life off the white sandy beaches.

Culture and history

Visit a working Maasai or Samburu traditional homestead and see their lifestyle firsthand. Stroll through abandoned ruins of ancient seaside settlements, walk along the narrow streets of old coastal towns or visit the landmark Fort Jesus, a Portuguese military citadel built in the 16th century.

Farm tours

Kenyan coffee is renowned the world over for its complex qualities. The cool highlands are an ideal terrain for tea growing. Artisanal cheese-making is now firmly entrenched in the food production landscape. Safari trips can be augmented with a tour of a coffee farm, tea plantation or a family run cheese-making factory to experience the local cultivation industry and sample some of the products.

Soft adventure

In Kenya you can liven up your safari with adventurous activities such as guided walks in the wilderness, hot-air balloon rides in the early morning, camel riding in the semi-arid north and horseback safaris in the plains among wildlife.

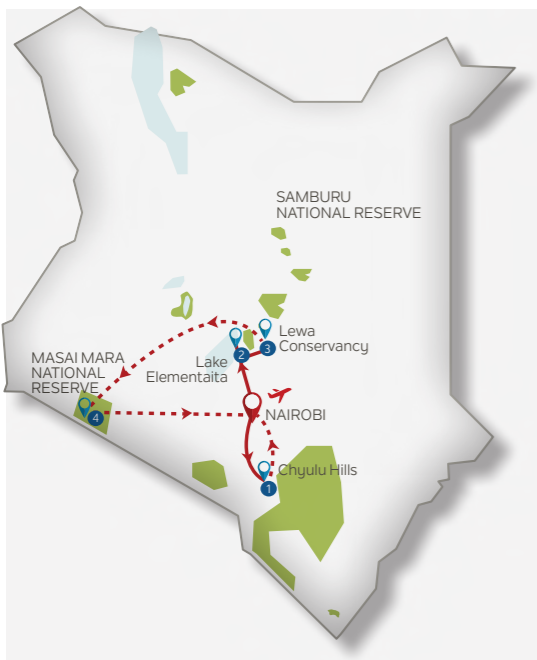

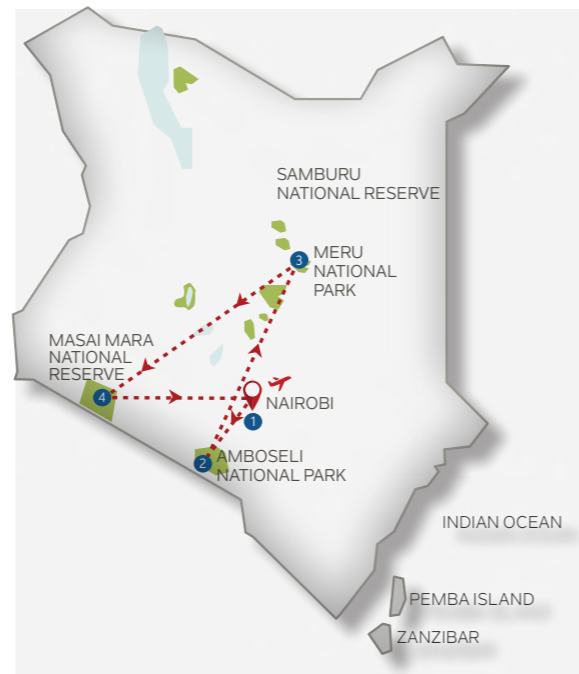

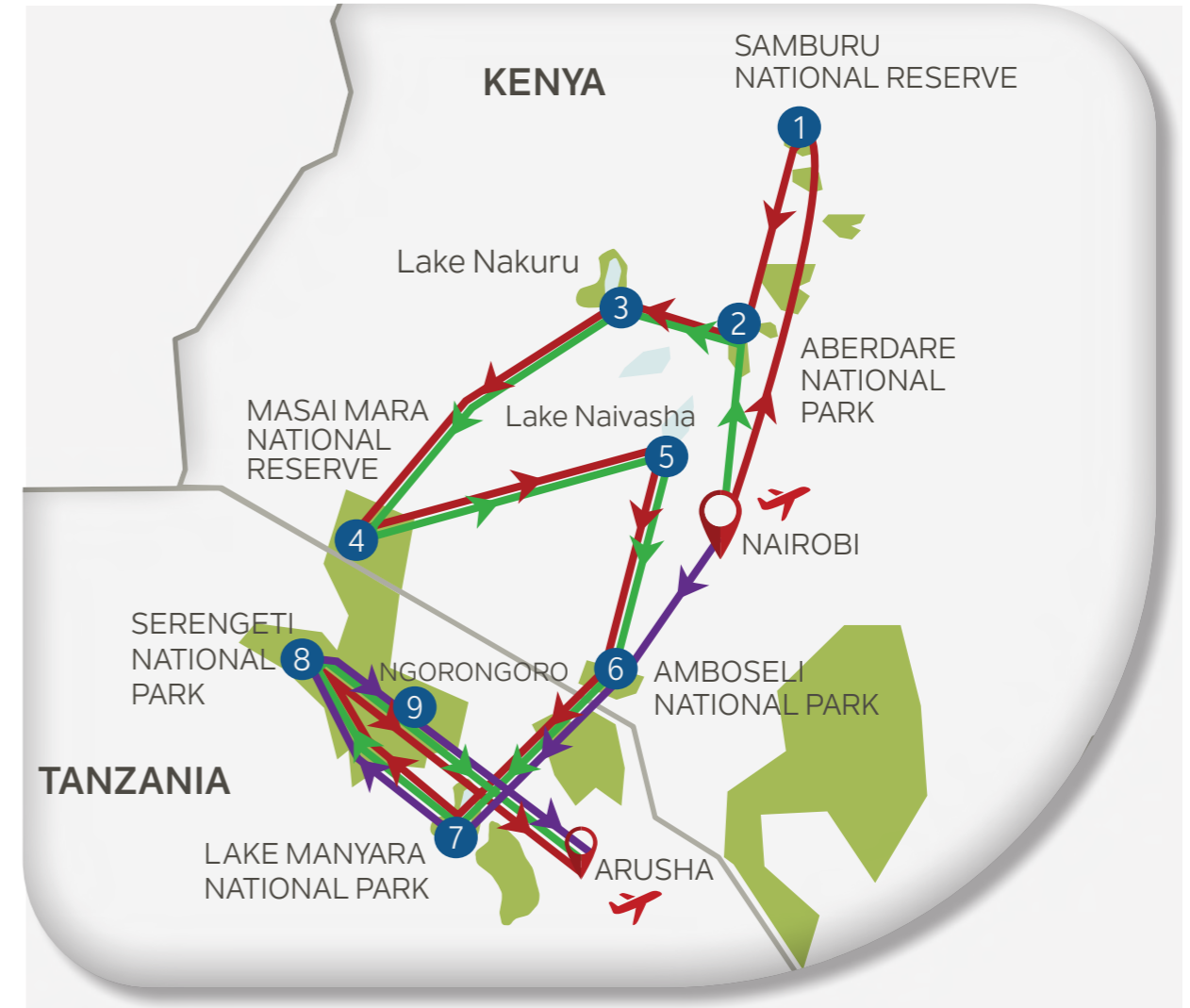

**Day 1
NAIROBI**
Guests arriving at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport are met by a Norine Forbes representative and transferred to their hotel. The day is spent at leisure.
Overnight at House of Waine – Breakfast.

**Day 2-3
LAKE NAIVASHA**
Guests depart after breakfast for the Giraffe Centre and the David Sheldrick's Elephant Orphanage via Nairobi's suburbs. Guests have the opportunity to interact with and learn more about orphaned elephant and rhino.

The Giraffe Centre gives guests the opportunity to see and feed the endangered Rothschild's giraffe. Guests take lunch at a city restaurant before departing for the Great Rift Valley. The Great Rift Valley Lodge which is perched above Lake Naivasha enjoying the sweeping floor of the world's largest valley.

The following day, guests spend a full day at Lake Naivasha and enjoy activities on offer. Children are invited to participate in organised activities including a bird walk, planting of trees to aid afforestation and a talk on the contribution of birds to the ecosystem. Lunch is served at the lodge. Children are offered a free golf lesson in the afternoon on one of Africa's most impressive golf courses.

Overnight at Great Rift Valley Lodge – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

**Day 4
OL PEJETA CONSERVANCY**
After breakfast the tour departs for the Ol Pejeta Conservancy. This conservancy is considered by many to be the leading conservancy in Kenya, if not all of Africa.

The conservancy is home to black and white rhino, large predators, and has the only chimpanzee sanctuary in the country. The main areas, which were once the ranch manager's house, retain an old world charm with floor-to-ceiling windows in the dining room that face the sprawling plains. The afternoon game drive is not to be missed.

Overnight at Sweetwaters Tented Camp – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

**Day 5
OL PEJETA CONSERVANCY**
After breakfast, guests spend another day at Ol Pejeta Conservancy.

From a working cattle ranch in colonial Kenya, to a trailblazer of conservation innovation, the story of Ol Pejeta is as enchanting as it is inspirational. It has some of the highest predator densities in Kenya, and still manages a very successful livestock programme.

Ol Pejeta also seeks to support the people living around its borders, to ensure wildlife conservation translates to better education, healthcare and infrastructure for the next generation of wildlife guardians. Activities of

the day include a visit to the Morani Centre.
Overnight at Sweetwaters Tented Camp – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

**Day 6
SAMBURU NATIONAL RESERVE**
After breakfast, guests depart for Samburu Intrepids in the Samburu National Reserve. Rugged and remote, Samburu hosts the 'Special 5' – Gerenuk antelope, reticulated giraffe, Beisa oryx, Somali ostrich and Grevy's zebra. Guests enjoy a morning and an afternoon game drive with an expert guide from the Samburu tribe.
Overnight at Samburu Intrepids Camp – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

**Day 7
SAMBURU NATIONAL RESERVE**
Guests spend a full day exploring the Samburu National Reserve, which was made famous by Joy and George Adamson and the story about Elsa the lioness in "Born Free".

Guests enjoy a morning and afternoon game drive and children are invited to participate in organised activities. The Samburu Intrepids Camp has private views over the wildlife-rich banks of the Ewaso Nyiro River.
Overnight at Samburu Intrepids Camp – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner..

**Day 8
MASAI MARA NATIONAL RESERVE**
The tour departs on a scheduled flight for Mara Intrepids Camp in the Masai Mara National

Reserve. The camp is perfectly positioned on the Talek River for the wildebeest migration (August-October).

At other times of the year, Mara Intrepids offers some of the finest 'Big 5' sightings in the Mara. Guests enjoy an afternoon game drive.
Overnight at Mara Intrepids Camp – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

**Day 9-10
MASAI MARA NATIONAL RESERVE**
An early-morning hot-air balloon flight with a champagne-style breakfast included is an optional way to start your morning.

Guests embark on an early morning game drive before returning to the lodge to spend the midday heat at leisure. The cooler hours, in the early morning and the late afternoon, provide the best game viewing opportunities.
Overnight at Mara Intrepids Camp – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

**Day 11
DEPARTURE**
Guests depart for Nairobi after breakfast, arriving at noon and for drop-off at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport or a city hotel. Guests extending their stay board a flight to Lamu.

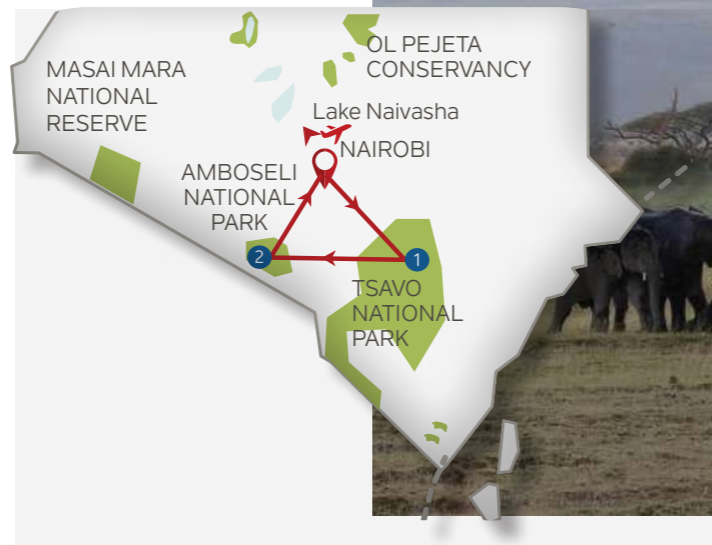

Nairobi to Nairobi | Classic Private Guided Tour

Day 1 TSAVO WEST NATIONAL PARK

Guests will be picked up early from their hotel and transferred to the Mtito Andei Railway Station for a 08h00 departure on the Madaraka Express to the Mtito Andei Railway Station. Upon arrival, visitors will be met by the Norine Forbes driver-guide who will assist with the transfer to Tsavo West National Park.

The park is a vast expanse of African savannah with a diverse array of habitats which include open plains, semi desert scrub, woodland, and the Chyulu Hills. Other ecosystems of Tsavo West are open grasslands, scrublands, acacia woodlands, riverine vegetation and rocky ridges. This diversity means a variety of wildlife for guests to see.

There is magnificent game viewing of elephant, giraffe rhino, hippo, lions, cheetah, leopards, buffalos, diverse plant and bird species, and for the keen birders, the threatened corncrake and near threatened Basra reed warbler. Arrive at Kilaguni Serena Lodge in time for lunch, and then enjoy a late afternoon game drive.

Overnight at Kilaguni Serena Lodge – Lunch and dinner.

Day 2 TSAVO WEST NATIONAL PARK

Enjoy breakfast before going on the first game

drive of the day. The varied habitats of Tsavo West National Park offer the ideal area to search for lion, buffalo, cheetah, and many plains game, as well as providing a diverse array of bird species.

The Mzima Springs is made up of four natural springs, the source of which is underneath the Chyulu Hills. The spring is a popular attraction at the Tsavo West due to the large numbers of hippo and Nile crocodiles that gather here, along with other wildlife, due to it being the main water source for many kilometres. It is a perfect place to stop and watch the wildlife antics. Guests enjoy an afternoon game drive.

Overnight at Kilaguni Serena Lodge – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 3 AMBOSELI NATIONAL PARK

Guests depart for an early morning game drive before having breakfast at the lodge. Afterwards, guests will leave the Tsavo West National Park and head north along the border to Amboseli National Park.

Amboseli National Park is one of the best places in Africa outside of Chobe to view large herds of elephant, as well as being home to a large variety of other wildlife. One of the most notable attractions of the park is the opportunity for guests to meet and interact with local Maasai people and learn

about their way of life and culture. Guests arrive at the lodge in time for lunch, and later, enjoy an afternoon game drive.

Overnight at Amboseli Serena Lodge – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 4 AMBOSELI NATIONAL PARK

Spend a full day in Amboseli National Park, with scheduled morning and late afternoon shared game drives. Amboseli National Park lies below the most famous symbol of Africa, Mount Kilimanjaro, the highest free-standing mountain in the world, rewarding visitors with stunning views when the weather is clear.

The park is home to large herds of elephant, as well as affords guests great opportunities to see lion, leopard, cheetah, buffalo, and more. For the bird lover, there are 400 species to try and spot.

Overnight at Amboseli Serena Lodge – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 5 DEPARTURE

Guests enjoy an early breakfast travelling to the Emali Railway Station to board the morning train back to Nairobi. Upon arrival in Nairobi, guests are met by a Norine Forbes representative, who will assist with the transfer to Jomo Kenyatta International Airport for further travel.

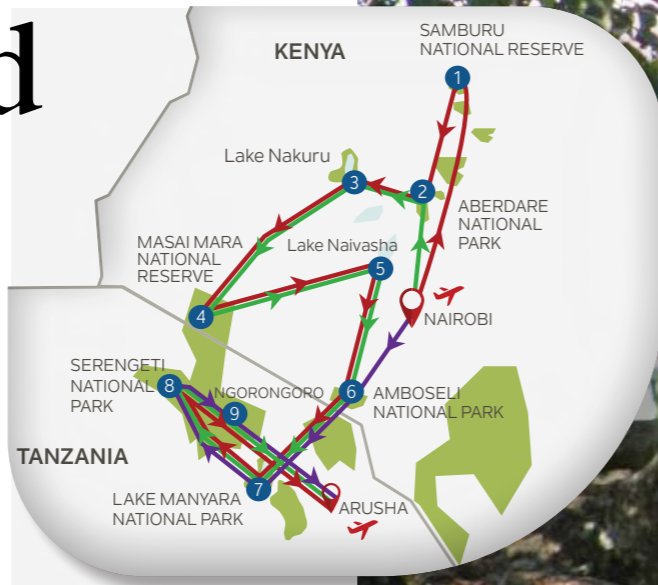

Day 1-2 SAMBURU NATIONAL RESERVE

Guests are picked up from Jomo Kenyatta International Airport or from their hotel in Nairobi by a Norine Forbes representative. The drive to Samburu National Reserve commences from there, with lunch being enjoyed en route at the Trout Tree restaurant. Guests will enjoy a game drive through the Samburu National Reserve while en route to the lodge. A full day is spent in the reserve with morning and afternoon game drives. Here guests find uncommon wildlife such as the reticulated giraffe, Gerenuk antelope, Somali ostrich, Beisa oryx and the rare Grevy's zebra.
Overnight at Ashnil Samburu Camp – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 3 ABERDARE NATIONAL PARK

Breakfast at the camp. Drive to the Aberdare mountain region, arrive for lunch and check in at the Aberdare Country Club with a later transfer to The Ark Lodge. Guests spend the rest of the day watching wildlife from the viewing decks at the lodge's natural waterhole, frequented by giant forest hogs, buffaloes, elephants, hyenas, Egyptian geese and the occasional leopard. The waterhole is floodlit by night so that guests may see the nocturnal wildlife. Dinner and overnight stay at the lodge.
Overnight at The Ark Lodge – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 4 LAKE NAKURU NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast, the tour departs for Lake Nakuru National Park and guests take a morning game drive. Guests savour a sumptuous lunch at Sarova Lion Hill Game Lodge, and then enjoy an afternoon game drive in the park.
Overnight at Sarova Lion Hill Game Lodge – Breakfast and dinner.

Day 5-6 MASAI MARA NATIONAL RESERVE

After breakfast, guests will then head towards the Masai Mara National Reserve. After lunch, an afternoon game drive in the reserve. The Masai Mara National Reserve is perhaps one of Africa's most diverse and spectacular ecosystems and affords guests with some of the best game viewing opportunities in the world. It is also home to the popular wildebeest migration.
Overnight at Sarova Mara Game Camp – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 7 LAKE NAIVASHA

Breakfast is enjoyed at the lodge before the tour returns to Lake Naivasha. After lunch, guests will go for an afternoon boat ride, spot wildlife coming to drink as well as the sizable population of hippos and water birds.
Overnight at Enashipai Resort – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 8-9 AMBOSELI NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast at the lodge, the tour departs for Amboseli National Park. Guests can look forward to an afternoon game drive in the park. Full day spent in the park with morning and afternoon game drives. Amboseli National Park is one Kenya's most popular parks, with five different habitats meaning visitors can see large herds of animals, all against the backdrop of Mt Kilimanjaro.
Overnight at Ol Tukai Lodge – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 10 NAMANGA – LAKE MANYARA NATIONAL PARK

Depart for the Namanga border after breakfast. After customs and immigrations, guests are met by their Tanzania driver-guide and travel on to Arusha for lunch. The afternoon is spent on a game drive in the Lake Manyara National Park, well-known for the tree-climbing lions and the soda ash lake full of flamingos.
Overnight at Acacia Farm House – Breakfast and dinner.

Day 11-12 SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

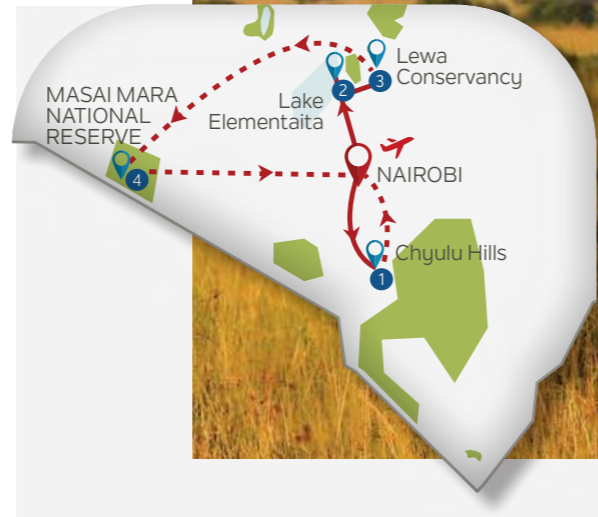

Day 1 NAIROBI – CHYULU HILLS

Parks of TANZANIA



Arusha National Park

Covering 552km² Arusha National Park lies in heart on Arusha town. Mount Meru, Africa's 5th highest mountain with an elevation of 4566m is located inside the park and is a popular expedition for mountain climbing. The unique primate population, including the blue monkey, black and white colobus monkey, live in this thick montane. It is also known for the 2.4km wide Ngurdoto Crater.

Tarangire National Park

Tarangire has the second highest concentration of wildlife of any Tanzanian national park and is reportedly the largest concentration of elephants in the world. The evocative baobab-studded landscape has excellent bird watching, with over 550 species in the park, the most breeding species in a habitat anywhere in the world. The rolling savannahs and acacia woodlands offer an inspiring array of wildlife.

Lake Manyara National Park

The western escarpment of the Rift Valley forms the park's western border. To the east lies Lake Manyara. This alkaline lake covers one-third of the park but shrinks considerably in dry season. During the rains flocks of flamingos are notably seen outside the park on the lake's east shore, as well as other birdlife. This often overlooked park has diverse vegetation ranging from savannah to marshes and evergreen forests. The 11 different ecosystems support one of the highest biomass densities of large mammals in the world. Home to a famous population of tree-climbing lions which are a real speciality here.

Ngorongoro Conservation Area

This UNESCO World Heritage Site is one of Africa's paramount attractions containing a deep, volcanic crater, the largest unflooded and unbroken caldera in the world. Hosting the highest density of both lions and overall predators in Africa, the game viewing is unsurpassed. The abundance of wildlife is largely due to the presence of water, both from the permanent springs that sustain the swamp, permanent streams and rivers fed by run-off from the crater rim forests.

Serengeti National Park

Tanzania's oldest and most popular national park, also a World Heritage site and a 7 Natural Wonder of the World. Encompassing the Serengeti ecosystem is the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, Maswa Game Reserve, the Loliondo, Grumeti and Ikorongo controlled areas and the Masai Mara National Reserve in Kenya. It is the Great Migration for which Serengeti is the most famous.

Katavi National Park

Katavi National Park is a remote safari location and Tanzania's third largest park. Along the rift of the escarpment in Tanzania's west, this area has some of the richest wildlife areas in the country. Lake Katavari and Katuma River hold Tanzania's densest hippopotamus and crocodile concentrations. In the dry season, the Katuma is reduced to a shallow trickle, being a vital water source amongst the animals. The most enthralling spectacle is provided by hippos when they all converge together in any riverine pool of adequate depth.

Mahale Mountains National Park

Mahale Mountains National Park lies on the shores of Lake Tanganyika in the Kigoma region. The park has several unusual characteristics. First, it is one of only 2 protected areas for chimpanzees in the country. The chimpanzee population in Mahale Mountains National Park is the largest known and, due to its size and remoteness, the chimpanzees flourish. It also the only place where chimpanzees and lions co-exist. This is one of the very few parks in Africa that must be experienced by foot.

Ruaha National Park

One of the lesser travelled parks, however the largest national park in Tanzania at 20 226km², it is rich in foliage and wildlife, in a landscape of remote beauty. This untouched ecosystem has unique game like the greater kudu which cannot be found in any other national park. The great Ruaha River is the main water source and considered the life line of the park. It is also responsible for hydro-electric power for the country at Mtera and Kidatu dams. There is excellent game viewing and 571 bird species with notable species such as the Ruaha red-billed hornbill.

Mikumi National Park

The most accessible park from Dar es Salaam and the fourth largest in Tanzania ensures excellent game viewing especially for those who are on limited time. The Mkata floodplain is a smaller scaled version of the Serengeti plains by comparison. An excellent bird-watching area with over 400 species recorded.

Nyerere Game Reserve

The Nyerere Game Reserve is Africa's largest protected area uninhabited by man at 55 000km², with plentiful wildlife impossible to tally, inclusive of fabulous lion prides, elephants, buffalo, hippo, crocodile and the world's largest population of wild dog. The Rufiji River is the main water source for this region and during the dry season large amounts of animals gather around the water's edge. Nyerere offers brilliant boating safaris and there is also fishing on offer. Experiencing the migration from Mozambique's Niassa Game Reserve in the dry season is a phenomenal opportunity with an estimated 64 000 elephants crossing between the 2 parks.

Saandani National Park

Saandani National Park is the only wildlife sanctuary adjacent to the sea in the historic triangle Bagamoya, Pangani and Zanzibar. This 1 100km² area has a hot and humid climate and offers has the rare experience of enjoying game while taking in the ocean air. Sange beach is a highlight of the north of the park with Wami River being the highlight of the south. This fantastic birding spot will also reveal crocodiles, hippos and lesser flamingos best seen by boat safaris. Another popular activity is a visit to the breeding site of the green turtle in the Madete area.



Tanzania ATTRACTIONS

Northern

The northern game parks are the centerpiece attractions of Tanzania. Serengeti, home of millions of wildebeest and rich concentrations of other animals. Inside the caldera that forms the Ngorongoro Crater is an exclusive wildlife paradise around a blue-green lake. Giant baobab trees are scattered across Tarangire Park that is a haven for elephants. The alkaline waters of Lake Natron are a breeding ground for flamingoes while Lake Magadi, Lake Manyara and Ngorongoro Crater also have flamingo populations.

Sequestered south

The southern parks are the silent gems Tanzania's natural heritage. Nyerere, Ruaha and Katavi see fewer visitors than the northern parks yet have a great diversity of game and true wilderness experiences. is the largest game reserve in Africa and bisected by the Rufiji River. In the dry season, the Ruaha River is a magnet for wildlife. Far-flung Katavi remains an untouched paradise.

Mountain climbing

Mt Kilimanjaro is a dormant volcano and the most recognizable landmark in Tanzania. This is a must-do for any serious mountain climber. There are several established trails and a typical hike is 6-8 days.

Idyllic islands

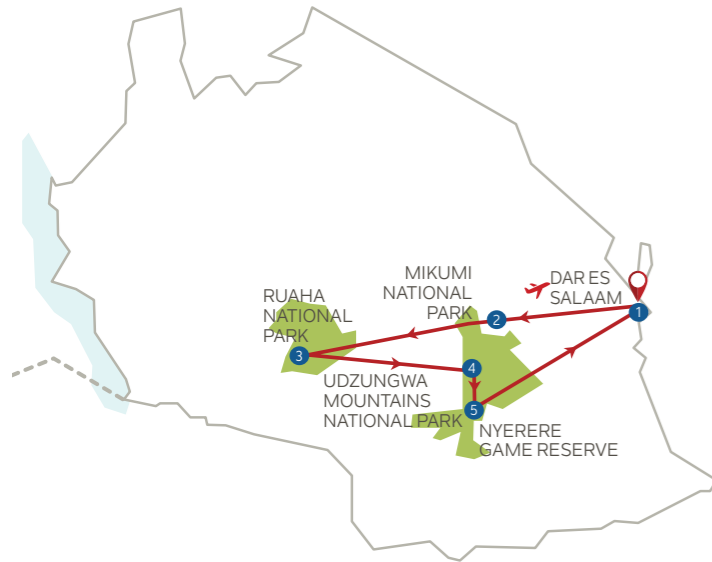

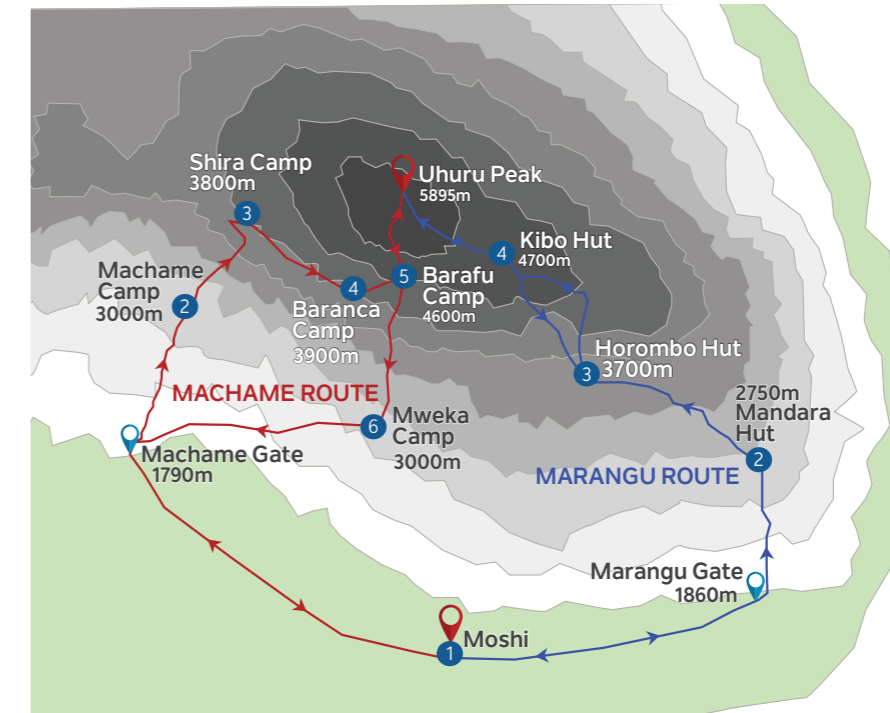

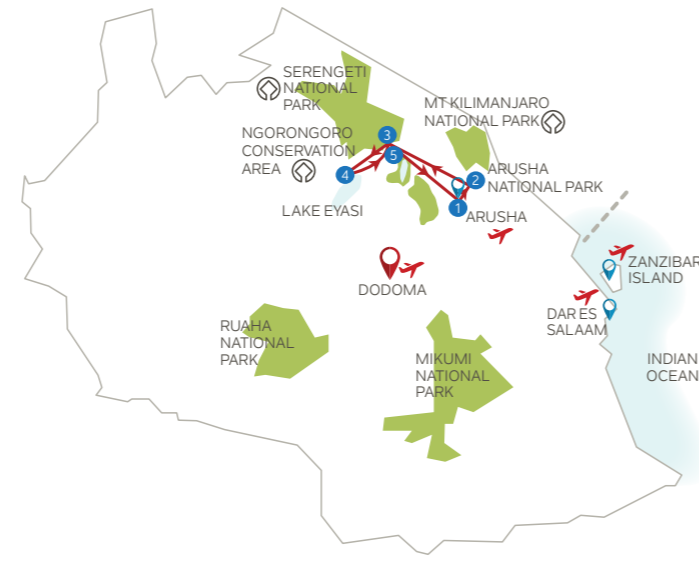

Day 1

DAR ES SALAAM

MIKUMI NATIONAL PARK

The tour departs after breakfast for Mikumi National Park. Lunch is enjoyed en route in Morogoro town. Mikumi borders on the Nyerere Game Reserve and its topography is often compared with the acacia-dotted savannah of the Serengeti. Local guides claim that tree climbing lions are more common in Mikumi than they are in the more publicised Manyara National Park. Guests enjoy an afternoon game drive.

Vuma Hills Tented Camp is located high up in the woodlands facing the facing the Mkata Plains. Rustic and comfortable, the camp is just 7km from the main Mikumi Park gates. At the end of a game drive, Vuma Camp is a cool retreat from the heat of the day.

Overnight at Vuma Hills Tented Camp – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Day 3

RUAHA NATIONAL PARK

The tour departs for the Ruaha National Park after breakfast, arriving in time for lunch. The park offers extraordinary scenery, diverse habitats, and exceptional game viewing. Ruaha is remote and off the beaten track, and as a result, the 4WD game drives are very rewarding.

Guests enjoy a game drive in the park.

Day 4-5

RUAHA NATIONAL PARK

The following days are spent in the park, with morning and afternoon game drives. Ruaha, named for the Great Ruaha River, is one of the largest national parks in Tanzania.

Known collectively as the Eastern Arc Mountains, this archipelago of isolated massifs is often called the African Galapagos for its endemic plants and animals. A secluded, quiet location is the setting for Udzungwa Mountain View Lodge. The picturesque falls and the forest are just 15 minutes away.

Visitors enjoy a visit to the Isimilia Historical site.

Overnight at Udzungwa Mountain View Lodge – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Day 7

UDZUNGWA MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK

Guests spend a full day in Udzungwa on a moderate guided trek to the summit of the Sanje Waterfalls. The vista from the summit is astonishing.

LAKE EYASI

They are skillful and are also known for their blacksmith skills, beads works, brass bracelets, and necklaces, while also supplying arrowheads to the Hadzabe tribe. Another cultural feature that distinguishes this tribe from other tribes is their decorative tattooing around their eyes in circular patterns.
Overnight at Kisima Ngeda Tented Camp – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Day 7
LAKE EYASI
 Guests receive a packed breakfast and then drive towards Hadzabe tribe who are considered one of the last hunter-gatherer tribes in Africa with approximately 1 300 tribe members.

As a hunter-gatherer society, the Hadzabe have no domesticated livestock, nor do they grow or store their own food. The Hadza survive by hunting their food with hand-made bows and

arrows and foraging for edible plants. The Hadza diet is primarily plant-based but also consists of meat, fat, and honey. They create temporary shelters of dried grass and branches, and they own few possessions.
Overnight at Kisima Ngeda Tented Camp – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Day 8
NGORONGORO HIGHLANDS
 After breakfast, guests will collect picnic lunches and drive to the Ngorongoro Conservation area where they will descend to the floor of the crater for a tour.

Quite possibly the most famous of all Africa's conservation areas, this is one of the places where they stand a good chance of seeing the 'Big 5'. Later, guests return to the lodge.

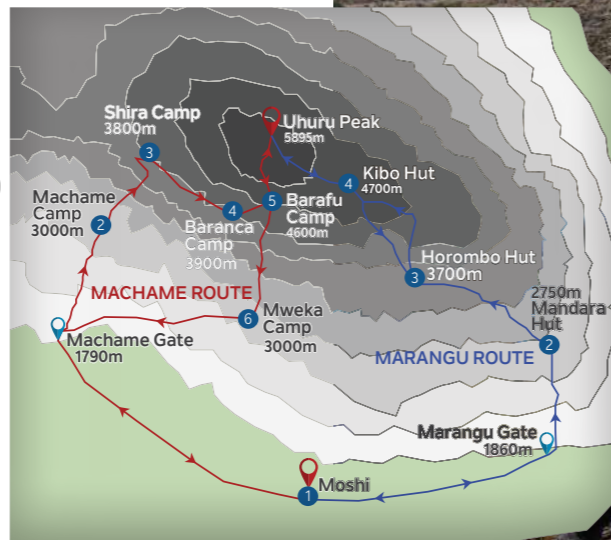

Mount Kilimanjaro Climbs



Marangu Route

- Has a reputation for being the “easiest” route, attributing to the lower success rate
- The shortest route, but less time to acclimatise. Ascent and descent on same route

Day 1
Guests arrive in the town of Moshi by their own arrangements, and can take the time to prepare themselves for the adventure that lies ahead.
Overnight at Ameg Lodge Kilimanjaro – Dinner.

Day 2
After breakfast guests are transferred to the Marangu Gate in the Kilimanjaro National Park where they will begin the trek to the summit of Mount Kilimanjaro.

The first day's trek will take them up to Mandara Hut (2 750m), through lush forest area.
Overnight at Mandara Hut – Breakfast and dinner.

Day 3
After breakfast, guests will begin the days' trek along a good path, which takes them through open moorlands and up to their next stop, Horombo Hut (3 700m).
Overnight at Horombo Hut – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 4
Following breakfast, guests will continue their ascent, which will go past the 'Last Water Point' to reach the Saddle, a dry area between the peaks of Kibo and Mawenzi (4 700m) that resembles a lunar landscape.

From here, it is about an hour's hike until the next overnight hut.

Day 5
Climbers depart at midnight for Gillman's Point (5 681m), which is on the crater rim, and arrive in time to watch the sun rise.

The next part of the ascent is steep, and the climbers continue the climb to Uhuru Peak (5 895m), the highest point in Africa.

After enjoying the views, guests then begin their descent back to Horombo Hut.
Overnight at Horombo Hut – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 6
The climb descends to the Marangu Gate from where climbers are transferred back to the overnight accommodation in Moshi.
Overnight at Ameg Lodge Kilimanjaro – Dinner.

Day 7
The climb concludes with breakfast and an outbound departure.

Note: Extra day to acclimatise at Horombo Hut on Day 4.

Live This!

There are several routes by which to reach Uhuru Peak, the highest summit of Mount Kilimanjaro, namely, Marangu, Rongai, Lemosho, Shira, Umbwe and Machame.

The 2 shortest routes, Marangu, and Machame, are less challenging and are often trekked by individuals with limited mountaineering experience. The trek to Uhuru Peak is considered to be a relatively straight forward endeavour; however, ample time must still be provided for proper acclimatization to prevent altitude sickness.

Trekkers on Mount Kilimanjaro typically have a support crew of guides and porters who are integral in helping climbers reach the summit. Summit attempts begin at midnight so that trekkers can reach the rim of the crater to view the sunrise.

After an early start (around midnight), climbers ascend to the crater rim to the first milestone, at Stella Point, in time to watch the sun rise. The climb continues to ascend up to the summit, Uhuru Peak (5 895m) – the highest point in Africa. The trail then descends to Barafu and on to Mweka (3 000m).
Overnight at Mweku – Breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 7
The climb descends to the Machame Gate from where climbers are transferred back to the overnight accommodation in Moshi.

Guests visit the Anglican Church, the old slave market, the State House, the Zanzibar Museum (opened in 1925) and the historic Stone Town, famous for its narrow alleyways and unique, 16th century Portuguese architecture.



Jozani Forest

Guests visit the Jozani Forest, the last extant jungle on the island; a sanctuary for the endangered Red Colobus Monkey.



Other natural diversity includes endemic birdlife, Blue Duiker and Suni. Lunch is not included.

Prison Island

Duration: Half Day

Also known as Changu Island and situated to the west of Zanzibar (30-minutes by motorboat). In 1893 the island was acquired as the locale for the new prison but was never used for the purposes it was originally acquired for. Guests can view the Giant Land Tortoise, some of which are over 100 years old.

Other activities include swimming or snorkelling at the local beach. Lunch is not included.

Parks and attractions of UGANDA

Queen Elizabeth National Park

The Queen Elizabeth National Park covering 1 978km² lies across the equator and is bordered to the southwest by Lake Edward and to the northeast by Lake George, with the Kazinga Channel connecting the two. It boasts of the highest biodiversity ratings of any game park or reserve in the world with almost 100 mammal species and an incredible 612 bird species.

There are 5 areas of vegetation which vary hugely from open savannah to rainforest, from dense papyrus swamps and crater lakes to the immensity of Lake Edward. The Queen's Pavilion, easily spotted by the northern entrance to the Crater Drive, became a permanent structure in 1959 for her visits.

Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park

Nestled in the southwest of the country, on the edge of the western Rift Valley, this 331km² of montane rainforest is the only forest in Africa where gorillas and chimpanzees occur together. A gorilla trek within the park is the highlight of all visits done to Uganda. The best time to do this is from June to September, as well as from December up to February, however, the park is open all year round. There are around 786 mountain gorillas in the world with majority of them living in Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, the remainder are found in Mgahinga Gorilla Park. The park is also a sanctuary for colobus monkeys and chimpanzees, as well as many birds, such as hornbills and turacos.

Kibale Forest

This 760km² area of rainforest, interspersed with patches of grassland and swamp, supports a rich variety of fauna, 250 species of animal and over 300 birds. There are 13 different primates within the park, which is the highest total for any Ugandan national park.

Chimpanzee tracking is the most popular activity in the park with a fascinating habituation experience on offer allowing one to spend the entire day with these impressive creatures. They are sociable, intelligent as well as communicative creatures. Look out for species such as grey-cheeked mangabeys along with red colobus, red and blue-tailed monkeys. Kanyanchu in the central part of Kibale is the main trailhead for the park's famous forest walks.

Murchison Falls National Park

This park is situated in the northern part of the Albertine Rift Valley. Here, the Nile explodes through a narrow gorge and cascades down 43m to become a placid river whose banks are flooded with hippos and crocodiles, waterbuck and buffalo. The vegetation is characterized by savannah, riverine forest and woodland. It's known as one of Uganda's ancient conservation areas and acknowledged for receiving prominent international visitors.

Trails through Kaniyo Pabidi forest inside Kichumbar Gate offer the opportunity to track chimpanzee and primates, and allows bird enthusiasts rare sightings such as yellow-footed flycatcher and the White-Thighed Hornbill. Murchison is

thought to have Uganda's largest population of Nile crocodiles and it also has a variety of water birds including the rare shoe-billed stork.

Kidepo Valley National Park

Tucked into the corner of Uganda's border with Sudan and Kenya, Kidepo Valley emits a real sense of wilderness enchanting its visitors. The mountainous terrain of the park is broken by the Narus Valley in the southwest and the Kidepo Valley in the northeast. The park is 1 442km² with most of the wildlife concentrated within the Narus Valley where the only permanent water is found in the park during dry season. Game viewing includes lion, leopard, jackal, Jackson's hartebeest, buffalo, giraffe, oribi and reedbuck.

Primates

Bwindi Impenetrable Forest is home to the largest population of mountain gorillas. Gorilla safaris here are more affordable than in Rwanda but the mountain hike to the sightings is said to be more taxing. Kibale Forest is a chimpanzee stronghold. They are more active and mostly arboreal, so chimp tracking offers a very different primate experience.

Home of kings

Uganda's royal heritage goes back to the 15th century and the Kingdom of Buganda is still a constitutional kingdom today. The Kasumbi Tombs are the royal burial grounds and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. A visit to the

Kabaka's Palace in Kampala city, a colonial mansion built in 1885, gives rich insight into this aspect of Uganda's history.

Tree climbing lions and shoebill storks

The southwest corner of Queen Elizabeth National Park is most famous for rare tree-climbing lions. The park's diverse ecosystem of the park is a habitat for big game as well as 600 species of bird. The shoebill stork, a reclusive and peculiar looking bird found only in Africa, lives in the swamplands of Murchison Falls, Lake Edward and the Mabamba wetlands near Kampala.

River escapades - Jinja

Just 2 hours from the capital city of Kampala is the riverside town of Jinja. It marks where the river Nile, arguably the longest river in the world, begins its 6 650km long journey to the Mediterranean Sea. White-water rafting, boat cruises and the 'Nile high' bungee jumping are some of the river adventures that one can experience.

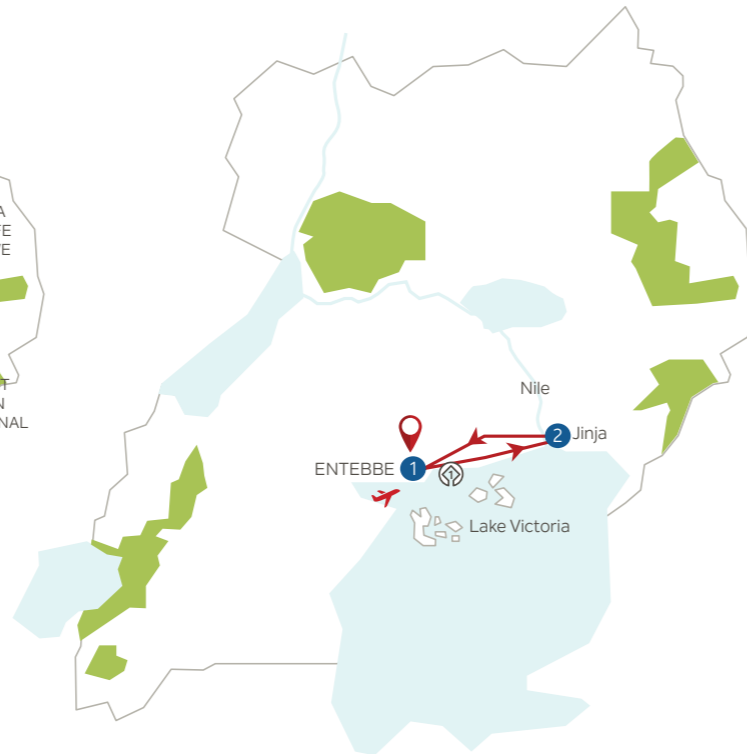

DAY 1

ENTEBBE

Guests arrive at Entebbe International Airport and are met by a Norine Forbes representative and are transferred to their hotel. The Boma Hotel is Entebbe's original and most exclusive hotel, set in tropical gardens in a leafy suburb, a few minutes' drive from Entebbe International Airport. The rooms combine the modern comforts one expects today with the charm and character of the original 1940's home.

Overnight at Boma Guest House – Breakfast.

DAY 2-3

MURCHISON FALLS NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast, the tour departs for Murchison Falls National Park, about a 5 hour drive. Inspired by the breathtaking splendour of the wild landscapes of Murchison Falls National Park and the history and culture of the Bunyoro region of Uganda, Kabalega Wilderness Lodge is uniquely located adjacent to one of the biggest natural reserves in Uganda. It comprises of individual safari cabins spread throughout 7 acres on the banks of the River Nile.

Kabalega Wilderness lodge derives its name from Omukama (King) Chwa II Kabalega, who was considered the greatest king in the history of Uganda. The lodge is a tribute to this great king and the people and culture of Bunyoro. Enjoy an evening game drive.

The following day, guests will take a morning game drive in the park. Lunch will be served at

the lodge and then enjoy a boat trip on the River Nile, followed by an afternoon game drive.

Overnight at Kabalega Wilderness Lodge – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

DAY 4

KIBALE FOREST NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast, guests will leave in the early morning for the drive to the Kibale Forest Park, about 7 hours. The park which is home to some 13 species of primates including the Red Colobus, chimpanzee, and L'Hoest's Monkey, as well as 70 mammal species. Primate Lodge Kibale's main highlight is their location, tucked deep in the forest and right next door to the starting point for chimpanzee tracking excursions. All of the 9 spacious and en-suite luxury cottages are each situated deep in the forest for maximum privacy and a natural 'living in nature' feel, with an adjoining large veranda with excellent views to the forest. Dinner will be served at the lodge.

Overnight at Primate Lodge Luxury Cottages – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

DAY 5-6

QUEEN ELIZABETH NATIONAL PARK

After a briefing, guests embark on chimp tracking in the Kibale Forest National Park, which takes about 2-3 hours. During the trek guests can see other primates such as Grey-Cheeked Mangabey, along with Red Tailed and Blue monkeys. Expert guides share the secrets of the forest's flora and fauna, ensuring that the hike is both informative and enjoyable.

In the afternoon, guests will drive to Queen Elizabeth National Park (about 3 hours) past volcanic crater lakes, and on a clear day, you can see the 'Mountains of the Moon', the Rwenzori Mountains. Guests then enjoy a late afternoon game drive.

Parkview Safari Lodge is located at the outskirts of Queen Elizabeth National Park, with panoramic views of the "medley of wonders" and capturing the beauty of the park in a most memorable way. The building style is a combination of modern and local materials, opening up to the wilderness beyond. The lodge reflects true African ambiance and hospitality, providing comfort to our esteemed guests.

The following day, after an early breakfast, enjoy morning game drive in the Queen Elizabeth National Park. In the late afternoon is a boat trip on the Kazinga Channel that is 32km long. This water system has the highest concentration of hippos in the world and we will get quite close to them. Guests can expect to see crocodiles, buffalo and other game that drink from the channel, and also marvel at the abundant birdlife that is supported here.

Overnight at Parkview Safari Lodge – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

DAY 7-8

BWINDI IMPENETRABLE NATIONAL PARK

After an early breakfast, guests will drive to Four Gorilla Lodge, about 6 hours, which is the

base for gorilla tracking. Four Gorillas Lodge consists of 8 spacious, comfortable rooms that provides a cozy, homely atmosphere. The Bwindi Impenetrable National Park (BINP) is a sanctuary for Colobus Monkeys, chimpanzees, and many birds. It is most notable for half of the world's population of the critically endangered mountain gorillas.

After breakfast, guests embark on the gorilla trek. Before 8am, they will report to the ranger station for registration and briefing by one of the rangers. The guides will then lead guests through the forest to track the gorillas. The trek can take anywhere from half an hour to 7 hours and a reasonable degree of fitness is required as well as a sturdy pair of walking boots. It is an extraordinary feeling sitting in the dense rainforest with the last remaining mountain gorillas. Exactly 1 hour is allowed with the gorillas before returning to the base station.

Overnight at Four Gorillas Lodge – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

DAY 9

DEPARTURE

Enjoy an early breakfast before guests transfer to the Kisoro Airport for a scheduled flight to Entebbe International airport. Transfers to international terminal for outbound flight.

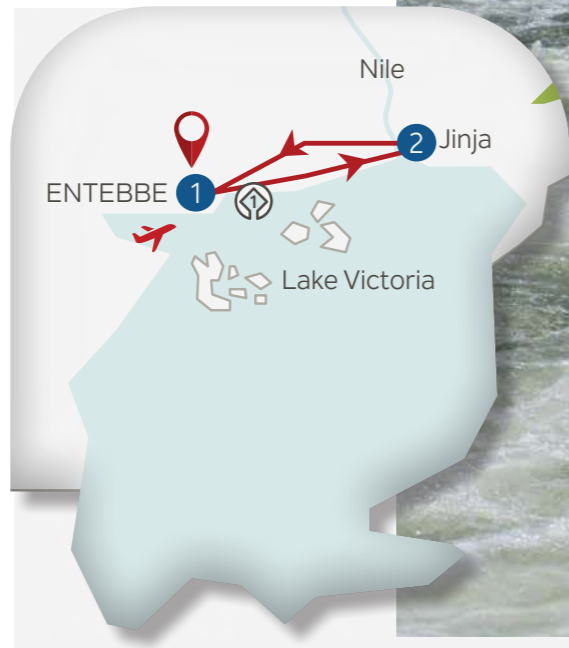

ENTEBBE

Day 2
LEMALA WILDWATERS LODGE

The lodge is at the heart of the Wildwaters Reserve, a group of mid-stream islands in the Nile, widely recognised as the home for the legendary white-water rafting on the Nile. These islands are also home to river otters, giant monitor lizards and hundreds of species of birds.

Nestled in a luxuriant rainforest on its own private island, mid-stream in the mighty Nile,

Lemala Wildwaters Lodge is breathtaking. Thick riverine forest naturally covers the island and each of the ten timber-floor rooms is nestled amidst the forest with private views over the River Nile and its rapids.

The expansive, canvas walled, traditionally thatched rooms each boast private decks with elegant free-standing baths and wash basins carved from the local pink granite. The main lodge is located quite unbelievably on a solid rock peninsula, amidst the rapids of the River Nile.

Guests can relax here, cooled by the constant breezes from the racing rapids or plunge into the adjacent natural swimming pool, carved by the river over millennia from pink granite. This is the ultimate location to enjoy one of the last wild areas of the entire Nile.

It sits along the northern shores of Lake Victoria near the source of the White Nile, Jinja is famous for being the historic source of the Nile River, where it then winds its way through Uganda, Sudan, and finally Egypt.

With a much more laid back feel than Kampala, Jinja has a friendly atmosphere, with warm weather all year round. Jinja is commonly regarded as the adventure capital of East Africa, because of the varied adrenaline activities available in town that visitors can take part in.

Local attractions include boat cruises from the the 'Source of the Nile' out onto Lake Victoria, Owen Falls Dam, cultural village walks, and a visit to the local Nile Breweries, Uganda's largest brewery.

For the more adventurous there are optional excursions which include white-water rafting, kayaking, quad biking, mountain biking and horse riding, and the 'Nile high' bungee jump. Another interesting visit would be to see the Bujagali Power Station, located about 8km north of Jinja. The hydroelectric facility provides 250 megawatts of electric power, and is the most powerful hydroelectric energy source in Uganda.

Overnight at Lemala Wildwaters Lodge or similar – Breakfast, lunch and dinner.

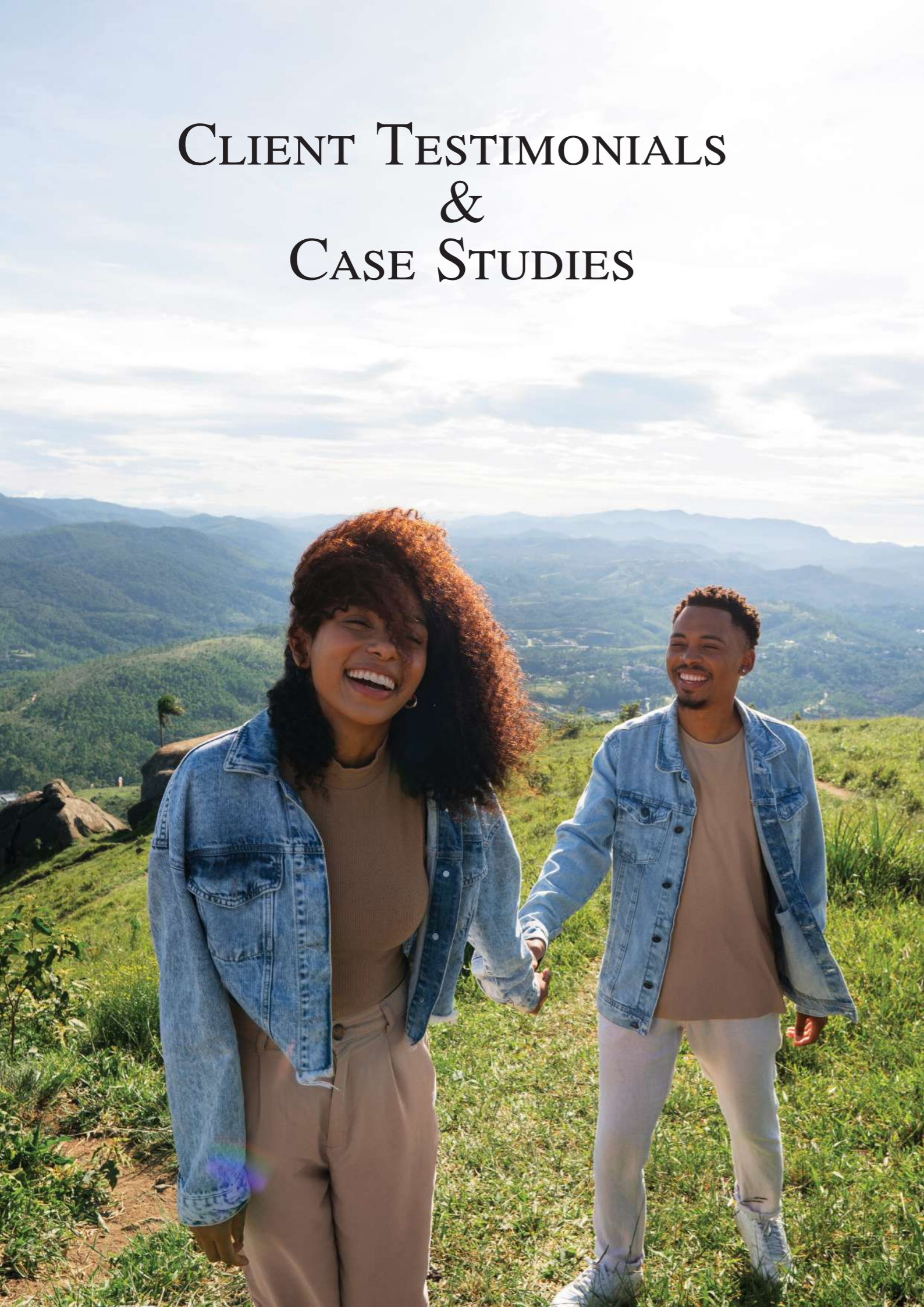
